

RSCE - RCEPPA Agreement OFFICIAL RELEASE

The Real Sociedad Canina de España (RSCE) and the Real Club Español del Perro de Pastor Alemán (RCEPPA) have reached an agreement that binds both entities in an environment of constructive collaboration in the field of national and international dog breeding.

With this agreement, the RSCE and the RCEPPA will collaborate in the exchange of knowledge and training, in addition to joining forces to defend the interests of breeders, aficionados and sportsmen, especially in all matters related to animal welfare and relevant regulations.

Both entities, officially recognized under RD 558/2001 as associations of breeders of purebred dogs in Spain, resume with this agreement a relationship of almost forty years, which highlights significant aspects in areas such as the recognition of stud books and their certifications, reciprocal participation in activities of dogs, exhibitors, sportsmen and judges, etc., including mutual concern for the development and recognition of dog sports as one of the cornerstones of the future of a modern and open cynophilia.

Furthermore, at the international level, both the RSCE and the RCEPPA will collaborate with their respective international associations (FCI and WUSV) in order to help ensure that the spirit of this agreement can serve as an example for future agreements worldwide.

Mr. José Miguel Doval Sánchez, President of the Real Sociedad Canina de España and Mr. Javier Silva Parrondo, President of the Real Club Español del Perro de Pastor Alemán, signed the document together with the other members of the Permanent Committee for the monitoring of this agreement, expressing their satisfaction for being able to bring an end to a situation in which the main losers were the dogs, their breeders and aficionados, opening a new period of collaboration and dialogue, as the only possible strategy to face the challenges that arise in the world of the purebred dog, both in Spain and in the rest of the world.
